

2010 NAA Classic Horse Show!

Show Rules and Schedule of Fees

1. "Every class offered herein whether covered by the rules and specifications of the current Appaloosa Rule Book or not will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith." NOTE: **ALL PARTICIPANTS IN THIS SHOW, MUST BE MEMBERS OF THE Appaloosa Horse Club, Incorporated, USA. To qualify for Pointing by NAA you must be a member of NAA by May 1 of the current year.**
2. Pre-entries for all classes and stall reservations close **July 2nd, 2010**. Post entries will be accepted at the show office for an additional **\$10.00 per horse and \$10 per stall**. The Scratch Fee is equal to the point fee for each class scratched; \$4 for Youth and Non-Pro and \$8 for Open Classes. Pre-booked classes and point fees are not refundable except as provided in rules 9 and 10..
3. The Management reserves the right to refuse any entry and to return any entry fees before the opening of the show, to prohibit any person attending or showing a horse in the ring from participating for just cause, and to remove any owner or stable employee or horse from the show without being liable for compensation of any kind. In any and all matters of dispute with the show committee, the decision of the show committee shall be final. The entrant's signature on the entry form constitutes compliance with and acceptance of all show rules.
4. Pre Entry blanks will not be accepted unless signed by the owner or his/her authorized agent. All Pre-Entries must be prepaid or accompanied by a blank check, unless other arrangements have been made with the show committee in advance. Stall pre-bookings are the responsibility of the booking party. Where a minor exhibitor is involved, the trainer if authorized, or a parent or guardian must sign and assume responsibility for the minor. Exhibitors are reminded that the ApHC and NYS Drug and Medication Rules are in effect and that N.A.A. has no way of knowing when or if random drug testing might occur. All medical waste must be disposed of properly and all rules will be strictly enforced.
 - a) **ALL Horses MUST BE STALLED.**
 - b) Individuals, Trainers or Stables pre-booking stalls are responsible for full payment. If you sublet to other exhibitors, owners or trainers; be sure to make arrangements for payment so as not to be left with the full amount due.
 - c) Stall Reservations are not refundable except as provided in rules 9 and 10..
 - d) Stall Reservations made at the show are not refundable once bedding is in place.
5. A surcharge of \$35.00 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks.
6. Canadian checks must be marked: **PAYABLE IN U.S. FUNDS** and include a \$5.00 posting fee. Please note, if you are a Canadian Resident, even though your account is held by a US Bank, the US bank will charge us \$5 to verify and post your transaction. N.A.A. has no control over this fee.
7. Exhibitors in Non-Pro classes must present their certification at the Show Office before numbers can be picked up. Please send a copy with your pre entries. No copies will be accepted at the show.
8. A number will be assigned to each horse by the show office when the entry is made. Exhibitors must supply the appropriate documentation, the horses stall number and any trainer or group designation in order to receive a number. This number must be displayed whenever the horse is shown.
9. **ONCE THE SHOW HAS STARTED, HORSES WHICH ARE NOT SHOWN IN THE CLASSES IN WHICH THEY ARE ENTERED FORFEIT THEIR FEES. PRIOR TO THE START OF THE SHOW, THE ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED OR DROPPED UPON A RECEIPT OF A CERTIFICATE SIGNED BY A VETERINARIAN. THE HORSE OR HORSES MAY NOT BE RE-ENTERED IN THE SHOW WITHOUT FORFEITING THE RIGHT TO A REFUND FOR MISSED CLASSES.** Exhibitors shall be held responsible for the entry fees of all horses entered by them or their agents even though payment of these fees is not submitted along with entry blanks at or during the show. If a horse or horses are disqualified from showing by the Management or officials, the entry fees will not be refunded.
10. Should any question or dispute arise, that is not provided for directly in the rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee, whose decision shall be final.
11. The Horse Show will not be responsible for any accident of any kind or nature that may occur to any animal, person or property. The exhibitors and spectators shall hold them harmless and indemnify them against any legal proceedings arising from any accident damages. This includes losses through any theft of property.
12. Stalls paid in advance are \$55. All Stalls at the show are \$65. Move In time is 12:00 Noon, Friday, May 29th, 2009. For early arrivals there is a \$12 additional fee for Thursday night, per stall used. Campers spaces pre-booked are \$65. Campers booked at the show are \$65
13. **Driving and lunging is only permitted in the warm-up ring located behind the DVM Barn at the discretion of the Show Committee.**
14. Each horse entered **MUST** be accompanied by a copy of the ApHC registration certificate, both sides, current Coggins certificate and a **RETAINABLE COPY OF THE RABIES CERTIFICATE**. The copy of your rabies certificate will be retained for our records. **This is New York State Law.** If you are planning to attend other shows in the area, plan accordingly. They will also need a copy of your rabies certificate to keep in their files. ApHC, ApHCC and Non-Pro Membership cards must be presented at the show secretary's booth upon request and at the time of entry.
15. **NEW YORK STATE HELMET LAW:**

Effective January 5, 2000, in the State of New York, the law requires that ALL PERSONS less than 14 years of age wear a helmet that meets or exceeds the ASTM F1163 (Safety Equipment Institute Certified) Equestrian Standard. This Law falls under Section 1265 of the Vehicle and Traffic Laws of the State of New York. Any individual on horseback/driving must wear the helmet at all times while mounted on a horse. In an effort to comply with New York State Law, the ApHC Board of Directors' Executive Committee has determined that in the State of New York, exhibitors 13 years of age and younger are not to be penalized for wearing a helmet in Western classes that does not look like a western hat. It is not the responsibility of the ApHC show man-

agement or judges to ensure that the exhibitors abide by this law or to ensure that helmets meet or exceed ASTM standards. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to ensure that their child is in compliance.

Effective June 1st, 2001 All persons operating a bicycle, moped, motorcycle, 4 wheel motorized off road vehicle (which includes 4x4's, 4 wheelers, lawn tractors, utility vehicles) on New York State Lands, Roadways and Highways must wear an approved helmet.

16. ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING IN THE BARN!!

ALL MEDICAL WASTE MUST BE DISPOSED OF IN THE PROPER RECEPTICLES PROVIDED ON THE FAIR GROUNDS UNDER NEW YORK STATE LAW!! THIS Policy WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED!!

17. Absolutely no cooking grills or open fires within 25 feet of the barns or fairgrounds buildings.

18. All motorized vehicles operated on the NYS Fairgrounds must be licensed (mopeds, motor bikes & three/four wheelers) as governed by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Operation inside the barns is limited to appropriate equipment only. Tractors and lawn tractors only may be utilized for their intended purpose. **Helmets are required** under New York State Law for all operators as specified in rule 15. **NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES, SCOOTERS OR OTHER MECHANIZED EQUIPMENT IS ALLOWED IN THE BARN AT ANY TIME.**

19. Manure is to be placed in designated areas ONLY. Never on the grass. Do not clean out trailers on the grass or pavement and leave the manure.

20. Trailers, not to be used for campers, are to be parked in the designated midway parking areas.

21. **ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH.** All animals on the grounds must have been vaccinated for rabies and be appropriated tagged or certified.

22. NAA needs your Email address to ensure proper mailings. Email allows NAA to communicate with you faster , thus speeding up all requests and activities. It also allows us to better inform you of upcoming events and news items.

23. NAA maintains a web site at www.naa1.org for your enjoyment and convenience. All of NAA's activities and shows as well as forms, will be posted there. The web site contains all of the information and forms for all of our events and is updated regularly. You are free to use any of the materials not protected for their intended purpose. Copying, transferring or distribution for any other purpose is prohibited without the expressed permission of the Northeastern Appaloosa Association, Inc., USA

24. All classes will be called before their running. Once the class is started the gate will be closed and announced as closed. Once closed, no exceptions will be made. The class is considered missed.

25. Judges Cards:

- a) Once any or all of the judges cards are in the hands of the ring steward after running a class, that class is considered over and all cards must be turned in to the ring steward.
- b) The class may not be rerun or re-judged.
- c) Once the ring steward has any or all cards after running the class, No cards that have been marked in any way, may be altered or returned to a judge or judges, except under the eyes of the show committee for signatures .
- d) The ring steward must turn all cards over to the show office or its courier for disposition after each class is run.
- e) Disputed cards, will be held by the show committee for disposition under the show and ApHC rules.

26. Stalls are reserved on a "First Come - First Reserved" basis. Because of the Camper Space layout on the NYS Fairgrounds, Camper Spaces are reserved on an open space basis. When you actually get to the NYS Fairgrounds, Camper Spaces are on a First Come—First Parked basis. If you use an awning, be prepared to pay for 2 spaces.

27. If you "dirty" a non-reserved stall, you will responsible to pay for it. This is a NYS Expo Center Policy.

28. Warm up rounds are defined as 3 minutes on the course for \$5. The referee will allow one horse and one rider to enter the course at a time and proceed for 3 minutes. The rider horse combination will be allowed to go the course at will for the entire 3 minutes. A 30 second warning will be called. When time is up, the rider and horse must exit the arena immediately. Additional rounds will be allowed once every horse & rider combination has had a single go at the course, but only as time permits. No block time purchasing is allowed.

29. Signing the Show Entry Form Declaration block signifies acknowledgement of the following requirement and conditions:

As per rule 703 of the ApHC Official Handbook and the show rules as established by NAA, I testify the owner is a current member of the ApHC and that the exhibitor is a current member of the ApHC, and that to receive regional points for year end awards the owner and exhibitor are members of the Northeastern Appaloosa As-

sociation in good standing. If the above information is found to be false, I or we are aware that I or we would lose all rights to the points and/or awards earned at this show.

I (We) hereby certify that every horse and exhibitor is eligible as entered and agree that the owner and any of his representatives, agents, trainer, lessee, rider, handler, driver, and the horse shall be subject to and bound by the by-laws and rules of the Appaloosa Horse Club, The Northeastern Appaloosa Association and the rules of this show, and will accept as final the decision of the Show Protest Committee and/or Disciplinary Committee on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the show, the ApHC, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken.

I will furnish a valid rabies certificate and current Coggins for each horse entered to the show management, and understand that any horse which develops a contagious disease during the show will be immediately quarantined and removed from the grounds in a timely manner. I will provide a photocopy of the ApHC registration papers with this application and a photocopy of the exhibitors ApHC or ApHCC membership card. I will further present the actual membership card to the show office staff upon requesting and receiving my show numbers. I assume all liability and responsibility for any accidents, injury or damages sustained caused by myself, my helpers, my stock and equipment, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless the sponsor's, the owners of the grounds in use and their representatives and employees.

I hereby acknowledge that the Northeastern Appaloosa Association has the sole right to control, sell, rent, supervise, or give away (or to assign to others the right to do so) the exclusive rights to broadcast, televise, reproduce, transmit and disseminate all or part of this event. I authorize NAA to make use of any photographs, films or video tapes taken of the above entered horses and riders, while on the grounds or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit in the promotion of the NAA Classic American Appaloosa Horse Show or NAA. No such advertising or promotional rights shall include the right to use a participant's name or likeness in a manner which implies endorsement of any company, or product category, or service.

Your signature on the back of the show entry form, acknowledges your understanding and acceptance of these terms and conditions here in all inclusive of the entire show rules and requirements.

30. NAA awards show high point and reserve trophies. As the final results for each division for the show are posted, the division high point and reserve high point trophies are assigned. Exhibitors must either wait for the awards to post and pick up their awards at the show, or watch for the posting of the award on our website after the show. Once posted, exhibitors must make arrangements with NAA to obtain their award. Awards can be picked up at the NAA Classic, EAA Classic or WNYAA shows at no charge. NAA will also ship your award to you for a shipping and handling charge. Awards not claimed or arranged for by January 1st of the following year, will be forfeited

The NYS Expo Center has again instituted new policy with regard to barn usage and show operations. N.A.A. has been privileged over the years to have the freedom to utilize the grounds to our advantage and that of the exhibitor. Please help us maintain our freedom of usage for both barns and the grounds by following these show rules. Thank you so much for your continued patronage, patience and co-operation!!!

2010 SCHEDULE OF FEES

The NAA Classic, held over Saturday and Sunday, is quad pointed. All classes will cost the exhibitor four times the fee to enter a class unless the exhibitor participates in the Overall Fee Program.

Post entries will be accepted at the show office for an additional \$10 Per Horse & \$10 Per Stall

The Scratch Fee for all classes is equal to the point fee for that class. \$4 Per Class for Youth and Non-Pro, \$8 Per Class for Open Classes . There is no additional fee to add a class.

ENTRY FEES:

Youth, Non-pro and Open Blanket Fee - \$145/weekend plus per class plus ApHC fees (Youth and NP \$1, Open \$2) Limit of 3 horses/exhibitor or 3 exhibitors/horse

Youth, Non-Pro and Open per class fee - \$9/judge plus per class plus ApHC fees (Youth and NP \$1 and Open \$2)

Youth and Non-Pro showing in Open classes must pay the \$2/class/judge ApHC fee.

HORSE OFFICE REGISTRATION FEE: \$10.00 Per Horse

****Stalls: Pre-Paid by July 2nd, 2010 - \$55@**

****Booked or Paid at the show - \$65@**

CAMPER FEE: \$65

Early Arrival Fee for Thursday Night: \$12

Returned Checks: \$35 plus the balance owed.

Pattern Books: Available at the Horse Show Office, \$2.00@

ALL HORSES MUST BE STALLED! ALL HORSES WILL BE ASSESSED A \$10 OFFICE FEE!

*Please see the rules governing the Overall Fee

(There will be NO REFUNDS On Stalls)

** New changes in the stall rates set by the NYS Fairgrounds will add \$12 to the above stall rates, for each stall used, for those arriving and staying over on Thursday night . The official move in time is Friday, July 9th, 2010 at 12:00 Noon. For campers, the use of awnings is prohibited where their use interferes with the parking of another camper. If you use your awning and it overlaps another space, you will be charged for two camper spaces.

Anyone that uses their trailer as a camper, whether hooked to electricity or not, should be located in the camper area and will be assessed the camper fee. This includes self contained units. This rule has been added and will be enforced by the management of the New York State Fairgrounds. Oversize Rigs should make advance arrangements for parking by contacting Mike Teske at 315-687-0096 or 315-374-1590, prior to arriving.

The following health requirements MUST be met by all horses

Horses stabled in New York State: You must present a Negative Coggins Test certificate dated in 2009 or 2010 and a valid current Rabies certificate. Please attach a legible, retainable copy of each to your entry form.

Horses stabled outside New York State: You must present a Negative Coggins Test certificate dated 2009 or 2010, a valid current Rabies certificate and a health certificate dated within 30 days of your arrival in New York State, from your local veterinarian. Please attach a legible, retainable copy of each to your entry blank.

Canada: The health requirements for our purposes are the same as for horses stabled outside New York State.

*Rules Governing the Overall Fee Option for Youth, Non-Pro and Open Classes

The Overall Fee **IS ON** the **INDIVIDUAL YOUTH, NON-PRO or Open Rider**. **ALL HORSES MUST BE STALLED!**

To take advantage of the **OVERALL FEE** for **YOUTH, NON-PRO or OPEN**, the **YOUTH, NON-PRO or OPEN** exhibitor **IS REQUIRED** to enter an **OPEN HALTER or OPEN PERFORMANCE** class at the time of entry.

The fees paid in addition to the Overall Fee **WILL BE \$2 Per Class Per Judge**, in *Nationally Pointed OPEN* Classes and **\$1 Per Class Per Judge** in *Nationally Pointed YOUTH and NON-PRO* Classes.

Under the YOUTH, NON-PROS and Open OVERALL FEE option you may show 3 horses per exhibitor or 3 exhibitors per horse for the \$145.00 fee (plus the appropriate point fee per class per judge and an office fee of \$10 per horse), in *ANY* and or *ALL* classes (*OPEN, HALTER, or PERFORMANCE, GAMES, NON-PRO OR YOUTH*) for which you are **ELIGIBLE**.

WALK/TROTTERS are excused from the Open Class Entry requirement. **Any other Exhibitor or Trainer riding horses for the Youth or Non-Pro** will be assessed full entry and point fees. **Trainers** have the option to participate in the overall program by using the **OPEN Fee Option** for a horse or horses that is, or are being used by a **YOUTH or NON-PRO**, but a **YOUTH or NON-PRO** paying an **overall fee does not allow for the TRAINER to show their horses in an OPEN class**.
